#### Treasurer's report (Lisa McCarthy)

#### Avoca Hockey Club Ltd – Financial Report, 24th May 2022

This evening, I present to you the Financial Statements for the year **ended 30<sup>th</sup> April 2021**.

I would like to start by thanking all the Committee members and Directors, who have supported me in my role throughout the past year. I would also like to thank all of our members for their support during this time. It was a difficult year with no play for large parts of the season. Many of the costs such as Insurance, remain fixed but as a Club we made every effort to secure reductions and funding where possible. Despite these difficulties, I am delighted to say we had a very good year financially, and as a result, we were in a secure position reserves wise for the next and future years.

#### Financial Statements as compared with prior year.

During year ended 30<sup>th</sup> April 2021, the Club had a surplus of €19,955 as compared to a loss of €14,428 the previous year. The reason for this positive upturn of €33K is due to the following:

Overall, our income was up €43K versus prior year.

Subscription Income was up just €36.5K, due to an increase in membership. This figures also includes income from camps which was broadly similar to camp income the previous year. Pitch rental was down €2K, we received Covid grants of €15K and we received a bursary donation of €7K. Again, I would like to thank our members who largely paid full subscriptions even though a lot less hockey was played. The club did run extra weeks of training for the Junior members during the Summer of 2021 and Senior subscriptions were reduced for the 2021-22 season

Our costs were up €10K largely as a result of the introduction of our Director of Hockey and a full year's salary for our Club Secretary.

Comparing our Financial statements with the Club budget set prior to the season commencing, I am delighted to say that we had budgeted for a surplus of €4K so we largely exceeded that. The main reason for this was reduced coaching costs due to the Club being closed at various times due to Covid.

#### **Balance Sheet:**

Cash in bank amounted to just under €87K at year end versus €32.5k.

Our accruals did increase by €18K mainly for accrued coaching costs which would be paid during the Summer for missed training during the year.

Net assets totalled €38K at year end versus €18K at previous period end.

#### Current Year 2021-22 season

The current season has been a great year for the Club. Operationally we had a great year – which you will hear about from Ben and other committee members. We had really strong reserves going



into this season which allowed us to make informed decisions and give something back to our loyal members. We had strong cash reserves at the end of this season and although accounts have yet to be finalised, we anticipate showing a surplus again this year.

#### **The Year Ahead**

Forecasts for the 2022/23 season these are being considered at present, but it is likely that we will see continued growth and further surplus. Fundraising for our new pitch has commenced and we appreciate all your support on this.

The result of all this hard work could be seen in the blitzes and competitive matches that the boys all played throughout the year. The primary boys finished off their season with the fun day in St Andrews while the u14s completed their league with a flourish sitting midtable, secured a silver medal in the recent Railway tournament and hope to better that and bring home a gold from the Armagh super8 International tournament on the June Bank Holiday.

All the success that the boys have enjoyed this season would not have been possible without the massive effort of managers, coaches and parents.

On the representative side of things Avoca had 5 u18 players representing Leinster in the interpros and subsequently 2 Irish squad players - Harry Dagg and Conor Murphy. Our u16s were represented in both Leinster and Irish squads by Hamish Scott and Oskar Nielson

Finally I am stepping down from Boys Chair and handing it over to Ruth sex and Belinda Crous. I want to thank all the managers and coaches and parents who have helped me over the years, to the boys who have made the position enjoyable and worthwhile.

#### Membership

For the 2021-22 season we had a record number of 485 Primary School Girls training with Avoca. We continue to see huge demand for hockey from the community and endeavour to do our best to get as many people as possible playing hockey, safely and without compromising the quality of the hockey we offer.

A real highlight of the season was the introduction of hockey for Senior Infants. We welcomed 60 players into the Senior Infant group and kitted them out with an Avoca branded mini stick and the Avoca bib which reached their knees! It was very special to see our newest class of Avoca players progress over the season.

#### **Hockey & Events**

Players and coaches were delighted that COVID restrictions eased allowing a return to full hockey training and a very welcome return to the buzz of blitz days. We had blitzes against Monkstown, Bray, Loreto, Muckross, Railway and Greenfields from Galway. Our new two pitch venue at St Andrews was a game changer for hosting blitzes, having two pitches in action with plenty of space for spectators generated a super atmosphere for all on these days.

Our 6th class girls had their first experience in Leinster Leagues, we entered 6 teams and 5 of these teams progressed from their group to playoffs which was a well-deserved result for players and coaches.

Our season ended with a fantastic finale full of fun on and off pitch in St Andrews. The sun shone down on us as the players took on a series of fun hockey challenges designed by Chris Stewart and the coaching team. Off pitch coffee, ice cream, face painting and balloonists kept all entertained for a brilliant end to the season. We also raised funds in a joint initiative supporting Down Syndrome Ireland through their Odd Socks appeal.

More than half of our junior members have taken up the option to extend their season and play on for an extra six weeks, nice to experience some warmer weather hockey and our 5th class girls get to Galway for a return fixture vs Greenfields.

Thanks to the coaching team for managing a great season of training and matches to cater for our players across our multiple venues.

Finally our hockey would not run so smoothly every week without the efforts of our class managers and all the parent volunteers. A big thanks for your continued involvement, the club is where it is because of you all.

#### **Senior Girls section (Simon Rees)**

The Senior Girls section for girls currently in 1st - 6th Years, continues to be hugely popular and successful here at Avoca. This season we had a total of 226 girls playing for 15 teams.

We had the introduction of the U18 Section from Leinster Hockey this season and so we were able to enter a team into this league. This is something that we have felt strongly about at Avoca and have been pushing Leinster to introduce for some time. We would encourage all our 5th and 6th Year girls to join this section where they can continue to train and play matches on Sundays with their friends.

In the 1st Years, we had 5 teams playing in the Leagues with 3 of the teams making it to the end of season play offs. The 3rd team in particular had a fantastic season, winning every league match to come top of their league and only just losing out in the Final.

In the Minor section (2nd Years), we fielded 3 teams. This was their introduction into 11 a side club hockey on a full pitch and they came up against some really strong opposition. We didn't manage to make it to the season play offs but we see great potential for the coming season as these girls move up to the Inters.

In the Inter section (3rd & 4th Years), we had 6 teams. This was a very successful season for the Inters with 5 teams making it to the season play offs. The Inter 1's and 4's both won their leagues in order to advance to the play offs. We look forward to welcoming many of these 4th Years into our U18 section this coming season.

The U18's was a brand new section introduced to bridge that gap between Inters and Women's hockey. 10 clubs entered this league and it proved to be hugely successful for us with Avoca coming 3rd. We look forward to another successful season in the U18's as nearly all of the girls are still eligible and will be joined we hope by a good number of 5th Year girls moving up from the Inters. I've received numerous reports from coaches and managers of what a great group of girls these are and how enjoyable the season has been.

#### Men's section (Andrew Ramsay)

#### Mens 1s and 2s joint success.

The M1s and M2s have both had their most successful seasons in many years due in large part to the collaborative approach adopted by Trevor Dagg (coach, M1s) and Kieran Bolger (coach, M2s), who have worked closely with one another to maximise the playing resources across the two groups.

Rather than having two siloed teams, competition for places was strong across the two squads, with training often combined and players moving up and down. This is exemplified by the fact that over 30 players were used in the first team across the season out of a group of approximately 40 players.

#### Mens 1s:

The M1s finished a very positive league campaign with an away victory over Railway Union (RU), which placed them level on points with RU but ultimately in second spot, due to RU having more goals scored in the head-to-head. Avoca came from behind twice in that game, a characteristic that can be observed from numerous games throughout the year. This strong character manifested in an unbeaten league run in the second half of the season, finishing the year with just 2 losses, 1 draw and an impressive 15 wins.

Despite a very strong league campaign, automatic qualification to EY2 was not guaranteed due to permutations outside of Avoca's control. As such, a play-off match was required against Belfast Harlequins, in Banbridge Hockey Club. No stone was left unturned and to good effect, as Avoca won the playoff match in 1 v 1s, securing a well-deserved promotion to the second tier of national hockey.

The league form was not matched with cup success unfortunately, which will undoubtedly be an objective for next season, after early exits in the Mills Cup, the Neville Cup, and the Irish Hockey Trophy. Regardless, Trevor Dagg, Rory Kirwan (Assistant Coach) and Brian Cleary (Manager) have done a fantastic job in reaching and surpassing the ambitious objectives for the season, all the while developing an excellent spirit and winning mentality in the group. With plenty of room for improvement, this team expects to go from strength-to-strength next year and beyond.

#### Men's 2:

A 1<sup>st</sup> team rarely succeeds without a successful 2<sup>nd</sup> team pushing them from behind. There is no doubt that the series of big wins for the 2s throughout the season provided inspiration to the broader group, providing the impetus for momentum in both team respective campaigns. In the previous full season in Division 1b (the highest possible for a 2nds teams), the 2nds recorded just a single point. This must be taken into consideration to fully appreciate the improvement this team has experienced.

Finishing the league this year in fourth place ahead of teams like Monkstown, Corinthians, Railway and Glenanne, is a huge success and a credit to the structure and desire Kieran Bolger has installed into the group. So many of their games were close, scrappy affairs, so to come out on top more often than not in these situations reflects very well on the character of the players as well as the coach.



With so much youth on the side of this team, and with more players expected to join next year, there are further opportunities to develop on the success of this year. Like the 1<sup>st</sup> team, the 2<sup>nds</sup> will hope to get on a cup run next season and maintain the impressive league form shown this season. Many outside the club were surprised to see how well this team did, those of us inside the club were not!

#### Men's 3:

The M3s could also be considered the Galacticos of years gone by mixed in with some top prospects for the future. The spine of the team boasts a lot of experience at a high level, experience that was well utilised in navigating a number of tricky fixtures, notably the likes of away days in Enniscorthy, North Kildare, and Kilkenny. The mixture of youth and experience was enough to land the 3s second place and once again, promotion into the next division. The importance of their promotion should not be understated, as it now means that Avoca have a men's team in their highest possible provincial league across the 1s, 2s, and 3s.

The 3s are an excellent example of the success of the club being exhibited across the board. The enthusiasm and commitment shown by their captain Markus Suttle, Manager Dave Spencer and Coach Ian Keogh is a testament to their achievements and an example for teams across the club to follow.

#### Men's 4:

Double success in **winning both the League and Cup** this season reflect extremely strongly on a team that have simply gone from strength to strength throughout the season. They achieved significant wins during a long season and were expertly guided through the year under the stewardship of Captain Seb, Manager James and Coach Herbie. The team have been promoted and look forward to stepping up to the challenge next year. A big shout out must go to James who ensured the best team was available across so many players, multiple injuries as well as clashes with other games – juggling is an art James has perfected!

#### Men's 5:

Due to the interruptions of COVID in the previous season, the league for the Men's 5s changed significantly as other Leinster clubs struggled to attract players back to line out. Our Men's 5s had no such challenges although did fully utilise the breath of players and experience available to them — dipping into schoolboy talent as well as our seasoned Vets to line out week in, week out. With a mid table finish in the league, they stepped into the Walters Cup at the end of the season which took on a new and novel format. They performed very well in the round robin and at the end of the season were in top position, awaiting being announced as winners.

#### **Development / Sponsorship / Fundraising section (Leo Sex)**

From a fund-raising perspective we have given ourselves a challenging target of raising funds to support the resurfacing of our Newpark pitch in 2022. Costs are expected to run north of 300k for the project. We are currently out to tender on the project awaiting the exact numbers to be returned. We have been successful in our application of a sports capital grant which will cover roughly half the project costs and we have some long-term arrangements with Newpark Comprehensive which cover costs over a phased approach.

Such a speedily turned around project of course will require levels of debt to be raised and to this point we mid negotiating a debt facility with the Blackrock Credit Union which will allow us to bridge the gap between fund raising, capital grants and project timelines. We are also speaking with Leinster Branch around the possibility of an interest free loan to cover some of the longer-term costs.

Efforts around fund raising began in earnest in December of last year where we raised 2,500.00EUR as part of our Christmas raffle.

January and February brought two very generous donations from supporters of the club with the main sponsor wishing to promote the Irish Kidney Association (IKA). Our Women and Men's first teams will therefore carry the IKA crest on their sleeve as they ply their trade in the EYHL next season. 
